What Your Children Learned in Roots of Empathy This Year

Theme 1- Meeting our Baby- Introducing the concept of empathy, how love grows brains, temperament traits, and how babies learn through their senses. Students will learn the "Hello" and "Goodbye" songs to sing to our baby when she visits. Students learn about how babies see and make a black and white pattern book as a gift for our baby.

Theme 2- Crying- Students learn that crying is a baby's main form of communication, and that a crying baby isn't a bad baby, but rather a baby with a problem who needs our help. Discuss temperament traits that are associated with crying and risk factors for shaken baby syndrome. Egg demonstration of what happens to a baby's brain if shaken. Discussions around how everyone feels stress and loneliness and everybody cries and how all feelings are okay. Students discuss how these emotions can impact our health and how we can calm ourselves or get help.

<u>Theme 3- Caring and Planning for Baby-</u> To instill in students that being a parent means making responsible decisions around routines and planning such as diapering, feeding and clothing. To raise awareness that parental bonding and secure attachment happens during daily routines such as diapering.

Theme 4- Relationships- Students will learn that we all have feelings and that everyone all over the world share the same feelings-that feelings are universal. Feelings are good to talk about and how to recognize and respond to the feelings of others. Discussion of what bullying is, and how it feels and that we all have a responsibility to step in and help someone if we see it.

Theme 5- Sleep- It is hard for babies to make the transition from being social and with the ones they love to being alone and going to sleep. That babies who struggle with sleep is not a bad baby, but a baby with a problem and that transitional objects can help. Students will learn about putting babies to sleep on their backs helps reduce the risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. Sleep is a universal need and students will examine their own sleep habits and learn the benefits of good sleep routines.

<u>Theme 6-Safety-</u> Safety issues for babies are connected to development and that as they reach new milestones babies face new threats. Parents have a huge responsibility to keep their babies safe, both in and out of the womb. Students will learn about the dangers of alcohol and secondhand smoke and discuss the things their own parents do to help keep them safe.

<u>Theme 7- Communicating-</u> Students learn how babies communicate and that the more parents talk to their babies the more they grow the baby's brain for future communication and language and reading skills. Discussions around body language and that babies

understand much more than they can communicate. Students learn that babies can use sign language to communicate and learn some sign language themselves. This session ends with discussion about the importance of nursery rhymes and students make a book of their favorite nursery rhymes as children and read it to our Roots of Empathy baby.

Theme 8- Who am I- Students learn that we are responsible for ourselves but we also have responsibilities to and for others, and that all babies all over the world deserve to be loved and cared for. In the first year, babies grow very fast and will give cues that they are ready for solid foods. Parents of new babies worry the most about their sleeping and eating habits and students will learn these are areas of autonomy and how to respect baby's cues. They will learn the importance of exposing babies to lots of different foods and to make meal time relaxed and for fun family bonding. Students will also learn about "Altruism" and make a time capsule about what happened the year the Roots of Empathy baby was born to give to her at final family visit.

Theme 9- Goodbye- We celebrate the baby's overall development over the school year. They will reflect on their favourite moments and what they will take away from this experience. Students are given the opportunity to consider what hopes and dreams we have for our baby when she reaches the age of the students, by creating a "Wishing Tree". We think about what things we can do right now to try to create a world like the one they wish for our baby and themselves.
